1.- WHO WE ARE

2.- INFORMATION

By accepting this Privacy Policy, the user is informed that the personal data provided through any of the channels provided by DIATER, as well as the data derived from the User's browsing, and any other data that the User may provide in the future, by any means provided for this purpose, will be processed by DIATER.

Users must read this Privacy Policy, which has been drafted in a clear and simple manner to facilitate its understanding, and may freely and voluntarily determine whether or not they wish to provide their personal data to DIATER.

3.- OBLIGATION TO PROVIDE DATA

The data requested on the form are required to comply with the purposes for which they are being collected, unless otherwise specified in the required field.

Therefore, if they are not provided or are not provided correctly, the User's requests cannot be fulfilled.

4.- FOR WHAT PURPOSE WILL DIATER PROCESS USER DATA?

To manage your registration and attendance to the meeting organised by DIATER, as well as to carry out a control of the attendees, in particular aimed at preventing access to the meeting from non-authorised persons. Where appropriate, this information may be used to inform you of new Diater events.

5.- WHAT USER DATA WILL DIATER PROCESS?

DIATER may process the following personal data concerning the User:

- Identification data
- Contact details
- Professional data and employment details
- Any other category of data that you provide to DIATER in the development of your relationship with us for the fulfilment of the purposes described above.

6.- WHAT IS THE LEGITIMACY OF THE PROCESSING?

The processing of data is legitimised on the basis of consent, expressed by means of voluntary registration, which may be revoked under the terms provided for in this Policy.

7.- PRESERVATION OF DATA

The User's personal data will be kept by DIATER for a period of one month from the date of the meeting.

8.- DATA TRANSFERS

The User's personal data may be transferred to the Public Administrations, Courts and Tribunals, in the cases provided for by law. In the event that DIATER intends to carry out a transfer of data other than those provided for in this section, the express consent of the User shall be requested.

International data transfers are not foreseen.

9.- USER LIABILITY

The User guarantees that the data provided to DIATER are truthful, accurate, complete and up to date. To this end, the User is accountable for the veracity of all the data provided and shall keep the information provided suitably updated, in such a way that it corresponds to their real situation.

Likewise, he/she guarantees that he/she has informed the third parties from whom he/she provides his/her data, if he/she does so, of the aspects contained in this document. Likewise, he/she guarantees that he/she has obtained their authorisation to provide their data to DIATER for the aforementioned purposes.

In any case, the user shall be liable for any false or inaccurate information provided through the forms provided for obtaining information and for any damages, direct or indirect, that this may cause to DIATER or third parties.

10.- EXERCISE OF RIGHTS

As the owner of the data, the User may send a letter to DIATER, to the address indicated in the heading of this Privacy Policy, or by means of an e-mail with proof of identity to the address: lopd@diater.com, at any time and free of charge, to exercise the following rights:

a) Right of Access:

You have the right to be informed by DIATER whether or not it is processing your personal data and, if so, to have access to such data and receive information on the purposes for which they are processed, the categories of data affected by the processing, the recipients to whom your personal data were transferred and the expected period of data retention, among other information.

b) Right of rectification and deletion:

You shall have the right to rectify inaccurate data concerning you, as well as to request the deletion of personal data, provided that the applicable legal requirements are met, and when such data are no longer necessary for the purposes for which they were collected.

c) Limitation of processing, withdrawal of consent and right of objection:

In certain circumstances (e.g. where the applicant is contesting the accuracy of his or her data, while the accuracy of the data is being verified), he or she may request that the processing of his or her personal data be restricted and processed only for the purpose of pursuing or defending claims.

You also have the right to revoke the consent given and to object to the processing at any time. In this case, DIATER shall cease processing, unless legitimate reasons can be demonstrated. Please note that in cases where the processing of data is necessary for DIATER to be able to fulfil a requested service, this cannot be provided without the corresponding personal data.

d) Data portability:

You shall have the right to receive the personal data that you have provided to DIATER in a structured, common and machine-readable format, and to be able to transmit them to another controller without being prevented from doing so by the controller to whom you have provided them, in accordance with the applicable law.

e) Decisiones individuales automatizadas:

In addition to the aforementioned rights, in the event that automated decisions are taken, including profiling, you have the right to obtain human intervention by DIATER, to express your point of view and challenge the decision.

Likewise, if you consider that your rights have been violated, you may lodge a complaint regarding the protection of your personal data with the Spanish Data Protection Agency or other competent supervisory authority.

11.- SECURITY MEASURES

DIATER shall process the User's data at all times in an absolutely confidential manner and shall maintain the mandatory duty of secrecy with regard to the same, in accordance with the provisions of the applicable regulations, adopting for this purpose the technical and organisational measures necessary to guarantee the security of the data and prevent its alteration, loss, processing or unauthorised access, taking into account the state of the technology, the nature of the data stored and the risks to which they are exposed.
